Dear Parents and friends of the Victoria German School,

The new school year is in full swing; children, parents and teachers have slowly settled into the routine. I am happy to let you know that we are starting the new school year with an increase in student numbers - at least when looking at the classes for children: We have 80 students registered in our classes, which is an increase of approx 20% compared to last year. The fall term adult courses show a good turnout as well, although the number of adult learners hasn't increased compared to the fall term of 2016. I have already had the chance to meet many of the new families and course participants at the UVIC campus in person and I hope to meet many more of you in the near future – maybe at one of our events such as the Laternenfest or the Weihnachtsfest!

We continue to maintain our good relationship with the Germanic Department and UVIC as a whole and I would like to express our gratitude for this very important collaboration. However, you might have noticed that our Tuesday classes are not entirely held in the Clearihue building anymore, but rather are taking place in the MacLaurin building. This somewhat unfortunate setting is not one that will change in the near future. The university is dealing with more and more students every year and it remains a challenge for the room booking department to allocate space for VGS.

We are happy to see many of the experienced teachers from previous years continuing to teach during the 2017/18 term. New on board this academic year are *Lisa Suessenbach* and *Gerlinde Weimer*, both of whom have already taught at VGS in the past. Changes have also happened in the school board - we do have a new treasurer and two new members at large. Last, but not least, we are happy to introduce our new administrative assistant, Debbie Sherwood, to you.

Following good tradition, this year we are once again planning a number of cultural events and activities that will enhance the German experience for our students.

I would also like to extend a warm welcome to all the new students at VGS and to those who are returning, we are very happy to have you with us again!
