Last Day of School & Abschlussfeier!

June 9th is the last day of school and also the day of our *Abschlussfeier*. We will start at 9.30am as usual in the A-wing of the Clearihue building. There will be "Kaffee & Kuchen" and you can also buy pretzels and "Bauernbrot".

For the first hour, the children will present their exhibition topics followed by some crafts where everyone can join in. Subsequently, the morning will conclude with the year end ceremony in the auditorium of the David Turpin Building. Report cards will be issued during the ceremony. Parents are asked to stay with their children for the entire time!

School Days will remain the same

Tuesdays and Saturdays will remain the instructional days for German classes for the next academic year. The envisioned change to Saturday-only classes is no longer pursued, as too many parents have expressed their concerns about not being able to join us on Saturdays.

Early Bird Registration & Tuition Information

VGS has been able to keep tuition the same for many years. Unfortunately, the tuition for the academic year 2018-19 will be raised slightly. We know that for many families, this tuition increase is not welcome news. But it is vital for VGS in order to provide quality of teaching. We will use the new funds to support teacher training and workshops for teachers. VGS, will of course, remain a non-forprofit school.

At the same time we will be introducing a flat fee for material for all classes which will eliminate all book fees. This will bring savings for some (unfortunately not for all) classes.

The new fee structure is as follows: Registration fee: \$50 (non-refundable) Material fee: \$30 Course fee: \$595 (for DSD classes \$620) Sibling Discount: 15% on course fee

Early birds will receive a \$50 discount! In order to qualify for the early bird bonus, you'll need to register your child and make a non-refundable payment of \$50 by June 10th.
